Dear members, dear godparents and supporters,

In our last newsletter we explained our financial situation and asked existing godparents to also consider becoming “supporting members” of the NGO in order to better distribute the costs for running the organisation among all supporters. We would then also be less dependent on the surplus from exchanging Euro into US Dollars.

This plea was answered by several people. A big thanks to each and every one of them!

The next logical step towards a more sustainable financial model for the organisation was the recalculation of the monthly contribution for the school sponsorships. To ensure that there is always enough money to take care of all godchildren as well as the various projects and initiatives on the ground, every sponsor should bear part of the cost.

We therefore decided to raise the monthly contribution for new sponsorships from 12 to 17 Euro per month. The raise by 5 Euro is based on the analysis of our cost over the past two years. **Existing sponsorships are not affected by these changes.** We would of course be very happy if everyone voluntarily raised their monthly contribution by 5 Euro and so shared the burden of the operational costs.

There is absolutely no reason to be worried about the quality of support our children and students receive. We have enough savings to ensure the smooth continuation of all of our projects for the next four to five years. We are merely shifting to a different payment model right now to guarantee the long-term financial sustainability of our work.

Crowdfunding for guitar lessons:



In the past there was one volunteer at the school who brought a guitar and started giving music lessons. He therefore started what quickly became a very successful crowdfunding campaign that ultimately enabled us to purchase 10 guitars including accessories for the school. The whole campaign ended up being so successful that we now actually have enough funds to make sure that, when needed, the guitars can be fixed or replaced.

Visit to DHL Express Cambodia



Kidshelp has traditionally had a good working relationship with Deutsche Post and DHL Express, as many of our supporters currently are or have worked with



the company. We are now trying to leverage these ties, for example by identifying ways for our students to start a career with them.

Thanks to the help of a very active member, Raphael and later Michael were able to start a conversation with the management of their Cambodia office. One of the early fruits of this exchange was a visit of our students to the company headquarters in Phnom Penh.

On a Wednesday evening, a total number of almost 30 students followed an invitation by the DHL Express Country Director and his team to receive an introduction on the work of the company and an overview of possible career paths within the organisation.

Especially the latter was very interesting for our students and we are hoping to place a few of them as interns with DHL Express very soon. This might then become the beginning of a long-lasting partnership and could potentially open up many opportunities for both organisations.

Visit of Raven and Leona – Olympic Games at the school



At the end of June, two well-known faces paid a visit to the school. Raven and Leona, who had volunteered with us in 2016, are currently travelling South-East Asia and they used this opportunity to revisit the children and their former colleagues.



This is why we had four volunteers staying at the school during the last week of June. They immediately agreed that we should make good use of this opportunity and initiated an Olympic Games themed project week.

This meant that aside from competing in a number of sports, the younger children designed and created their own medals while the

older classes learned about the history of the Olympics.

Even though the biggest sports complex of the country is called “Olympic Stadium”, “the Games” never actually took place in Cambodia and none of the children had even heard of them before. This did of course not curb their enthusiasm in any way and while the school already is a place of joy, the project week and its activities led to even more laughter and happy faces.
