Conditional cash support	Monthly support to the families or the scholarship holders, in return for proof that the child in questions continues to attend public school.	In order to qualify for continued financial support, the scholarship holders continue to visit public school – during Covid payments continued without proof but monthly checks now reinstated
Family counselling	Counselling scholarship holders as well as their parents on the benefits of education	Enhanced awareness on the benefits of education. Hence, the scholarship holders are more

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		likely to continue to visit public school.
Monitoring and Reporting	Creating irregular progress reports on the situation of scholarship holders based on family interviews and school documentation.	Better understanding of the situation of our beneficiaries. Being able to provide appropriate advice and targeted assistance.
Eye screening	Following discussions with a Cambodian NGO, Khmer Sight Foundation, we supported them to run a further eye screening for parents and adults in our village.	Following successful screening in 2022, this follow-up screening identified a further 25 adults requiring cataract surgeries. This will mean less dependency on support on younger family members and allow children more time to study.
Communication with sponsors	Provision of progress report to the individual sponsors of the scholarship holder. Responding to questions of individual sponsors.	Sponsors feel the impact of their donations and continue to provide funding.
Identification of scholarship candidates	Identifying talented children in risk of early school dropout. For example, due to lack of financial resources. During the year we signed new 3-year MOU's with The Ministry of Foreign Affairs & International Cooperation and Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport as existing agreements had expired.

A meeting was held with the British Ambassador in Cambodia to raise awareness of the work of Kidshelp.

Reopening of school and recruitment	Our school was able to reopen in November 2021 but rebuilding class numbers has been slow. During 2022 we introduced 4 sessions rather than 2 as pre- Covid but following changes to State school timetables we now have 13:00 to 15:00; 15:00 to 17:00 and 17:00 to 19:00.	We are working to rebalance class sizes, encouraging hand washing and care. Aim is to have 40% of students in the afternoon classes. The need to reintroduce school fees was a challenge but slowly being resolved.
English class	Teaching English reading, writing, listening, and speaking	The English proficiency of the school children is enhanced.
General education class	Teaching various topics (for example hygiene and food security) in English language depending on the qualification of the teachers and volunteers.	The English proficiency and the general knowledge of the children are enhanced.
Computer class	Teaching to type and to use office software	The computer literacy of the school children is enhanced. During this period several laptops were donated and there will be greater usage during 2024.

This project will teach skills in project management and conducting work in the community.
